## **Typical African Blank Treaty 1880s**

Imperialist treaty making often followed a preconceived pattern. Agents bearing supplies of liquors and tinseled ornaments together with blank treaty forms set out on treaty-making expeditions. The blank treaty reproduced below was used by the Royal Niger Company in its drive to acquire sovereign rights in the valley of the Niger.
